Voting No protects women.	Ohio passed an extreme 6-week abortion ban, with no exceptions for rape or incest. <u>The ban prevents doctors from acting until the patient is on the brink of death.</u>
Planned Parenthood, and others are spending millions of dollars attempting to enshrine <u>abortion-until-birth</u> , with <u>zero restrictions</u> , into Ohio’s Constitution this fall.	*The amendment says: “abortion may be prohibited after fetal viability... <u>Viability means able to survive outside the body.</u> In no case may it be prohibited if the patients treating physician’s professional judgement deems necessary to protect the patient’s life and health.

<p>Issue 1 <u>allows gender-reaffirming care.</u></p>	<p>Issue 1 has nothing to do about gender-reaffirming care.</p> <p><u>Gender-reaffirming care is not in the amendment.</u></p> <p>*The amendment says:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • continuing one's pregnancy • contraception • fertility treatment • miscarriage treatment • abortion • ensuring safe and accessible medical treatments are available when needed.
<p>Issue 1 would change state law on parental notification for minors.</p>	<p>Current <u>state law regarding parental notification is not changed</u> in the amendment.</p> <p>Current state law requires a parent, guardian or judge to approve any medical procedures for a minor, including;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • continuing one's pregnancy • contraception • fertility treatment • miscarriage treatment • abortion • ensuring safe and accessible medical treatments are available when needed.
<p>Abortion on demand <u>will be allowed up to the moment of birth</u> - 'allow an unborn child to be aborted at any stage of pregnancy, regardless of viability.'</p>	<p>The amendment states: However, abortion <u>may be prohibited after fetal viability.</u></p> <p>But in no case may such an abortion be prohibited if in the professional judgement of the pregnant person's treating physician it is necessary to protect the pregnant person's life or health.'</p> <p>According to the U.S. Center for Disease Control and Prevention, about 1% of nationwide occur in extreme circumstances after 21 weeks - usually <u>due to risk of the pregnant person's life, birth defects so severe that the fetus cannot survive, ectopic pregnancy,</u></p>
